Obituary

In loving memory of Myles Elliott Wright, age 26, who passed suddenly on May 21, 2020, in Toledo, OH.

Myles was born June 27, 1993 in Fayetteville, NC, at Fort Bragg Veterans Hospital to Sergeant Elliott & Corporal Fionne Wright whom both served in the Gulf War (Desert Shield/Desert Storm).
